Dear Frank : –

I don't know whether you are expecting a letter from me or not But I will write anyway

I suppose you are O.K. or I hope so anyway. I am feeling fine quite a number of exciting things happened yesterday and of course I had them all to witness. One thing that happen the 1 o'clock car killed a large hog at the crossing and I had to view the corsepe and another thing was to see the dog kill a big mud turtle that was real funny. I was at Maude's yesterday. You said that I only believed 1/16 of what you said I think I believe little more than that But how could I believe all when you don't mean for me to Look at what you put in my letter you was certainly 'kiddin' me and I know it. But I was awful glad to get your letter just the same.

Well how is [] by this time! I am going to look for you Snuday if you don't caren me before then But I might me jilted now for all that I can tell I hav't see you for so long, awaiting to learn my fate.

Historical Notes:

Frank Harrison Parsons (1889 – 1918) was the son of Adrian Alkanah (1846 – 1929) and Mary Mariah (Fox) Parsons (1850 – 1922) and grew up on his father's farm in Washington Township.

"Maude" may be Laura Maude (Symmonds) Parsons (1885 – 1965) who married Frank's brother Gilbert "Bert" Roland Parsons (1883 – 1959) in November, 1909.

"Peg" is unknown.
