Merion R. had the leading part in one play and a minor part in the other. (I'm glad I wasn't her). She was so dumb she couldn't learn her part so she had to read it (Such is life)

Janet, please come down Friday morning and go to 4-H with me in the afternoon you see many of the kids in our room. Have your dad or Elsie bring you down. I think you could come as the corn is all planted (or at least it ought to be). Well, I suppose I had better close as the irons are on the stove wailing to be used. Boy. I hate to iron, but it is always necessary.

Historical Notes:

Janet Pauline Hennipman (1923 - 1938) was daughter of Dutch immigrants John (1887 - 1968) and Elsie (Van Dyke) Hennipman (1891 - 1992). Janet was the 4th of 5 sisters and lived near what is now the corner of 200N and Raceway Rd. She died June 14, 1938 of strep throat.

Mary Ann Beeler (1924 - 2017) was the daughter of Raymond Taylor (1899 - 1974) and Bertha Leota (Sullivan) Beeler (1899 - 1983). Mary Ann lived within a mile of Janet Hennipman and graduated from Avon High School in 1942.

Virginia Miller Parsons (1921 - 2018) was the sister of Mary Frances Parsons and was referred to as "Ninnie" in letters. Virginia graduated from Avon High School in 1939.

Merion Elizabeth Ray (1922 - 1973) was the daughter of Forest Ansil (1898 - 1966) and Jeannette B (Gibbs) Ray (1896 -1991) Merion was the oldest of 4 children. By 1940 the family was living in Eel River Twp., so Merion did not graduate from Avon High School.

Mary Frances "Jake" Parsons (1923 - 1996) was the daughter of Chester Adrian (1887 - 1977) and Hazel (Miller) Parsons (1896 - 1983). Mary was the 2^{nd} of three children and lived near what is now the corner of County Road 625 S and 100S, about 7 miles from Janet. She graduated from Avon High School in 1941.

Wa-Pe-Ke-Way Farm was named by Mary Frances Parsons' grandfather after he purchased the farm in 1885. It is a Native American name for White Lick Creek that flows through the farm.
