Ron was active in the military and was wounded in Viet Nam. Ron maintained a friendship with Ida and Mary long after high school.


I remember Ron as being the smallest guy in the class, having the cutest baby picture in the yearbook, being soft spoken with a very funny sense of humor and a deep thinker.

Vernon Spellman - glasses, dark hair, quiet




Senior Trip Memories


Joe Clossey



PS I hope your telephone bill wasn't to high, Sheila! Loved talking to you!




Dwight Poole


Animal Shelter (which takes place tomorrow)!
